### **Property Manager's** Report

The summer has flown by. The painters are almost finished on property. Everything looks fresh and clean. We are trying to make sure that everyone obeys the rules to keep the walkways, railings, & buildings beautiful. Please, no mats, plants, bikes or rugs on the walkways. This is against Fire Code. These things damage the paint of the walkways, walks and handrails. If you have a mat outside your door, it needs to be placed inside your unit. You may be subject to a fine if it is left outside.

Plants belong in your unit or on your porch, not on the walkways. Washing of rugs is not allowed in our washers, so by hanging them to dry on the railings shows that you are breaking two rules. Please do not hang anything on the railings. Railings are not clothes lines. Help keep LCG beautiful by following the rules!

The East Pool is under construction. We will attempt to keep the BBQ area and lower deck open during the Pool renovation. The West Pool is open for your use. Remember to exercise caution and let the workers do their jobs without interruptions and stay out of taped off areas. If you have a question or concern, please see me in the office.

The men are working on power washing the common areas. Again, use caution in these areas. We are doing our fall maintenance in preparation for season. Please let the

#### **Accidents Happen**

Home safety is important, particularly for seniors. For those who are living at home, especially those living alone, it is important to take proper precautions to make sure your home is safe. Here are some simple, affordable ways you can reduce the risk of falls and other injuries in your home:



#### **Bathroom Safety**

- Place non-skid strips on the floor of your tub or shower.
- Use rubber matting and a shower chair inside the shower.
- Use a hand-held lightweight shower head to make bathing and cleaning easier.



- Add a motion-sensor light or night light to your bathroom for added safety at night.
- Install grab bars throughout the room, which can also serve as towel racks.
- Install a 'comfort height' toilet that makes it easier to sit and stand.
- Replace your bathtub with a walk-in shower and a bathing seat.

#### **Kitchen Safety**


- Install and regularly maintain a high-quality smoke detector that has a 'hush' feature to temporarily silence false alarms.
- Regularly clean out vents and grease traps.
- Keep a fire extinguisher handy.
- Move heavy dishes and pots to lower cabinets that are easier to reach.
- Invest in appliances that shut off automatically, such as induction stovetops and kettles that can't be boiled dry.



#### **General Home Safety**



- Remove any tripping hazards like loose area rugs, uneven floorboards, or extension cords.
- Place motion-activated lights throughout your home to improve visibility.
- Use timers to turn lights on at dusk.
- Purchase battery-backup lighting that is activated during a power outage.
- Keep your doors and windows locked at all times; many break-ins occur during daylight hours.
- Maintain an emergency supply of food and water along with a week's worth of any prescription medications.
- Keep rooms clean and free of clutter and make sure walkways are free of cords and wires.
- Consider taking a portable phone with you as you move room to room just in case a fall occurs.

Threaten to turn off power, water or natural gas service to your home or business within a few hours.





**Demand immediate** payment with a prepaid debit card.

#### Suspect a scammer?

Here's what to do if the call seems suspicious:

- Hang up.
- (2) Call the police.
- 3 Call your utility provider at the phone number on your bill.



DO NOT pay over the phone if immediate payment with a prepaid debit card is demanded to avoid disconnection.


